**1827** Petrache Poenaru, a Roman inventor, patented the fountain pen in 1827. The pen's ink barrel meant it didn't need to be dipped in ink regularly. However, the design was flawed and was never perfected.

**1884** Lewis Edson Waterman patented the three-channel ink feed fountain pen. The design meant smooth ink flow. For the first time, the pen became a truly transportable tool.

**20th Century** The fountain pen benefited from many inventions throughout the 20th century, like the use of replaceable and refillable ink cartridges, the use of different materials (plastic, metal, wood, etc.), new cap closure designs, ink formulas, and ink filling systems.

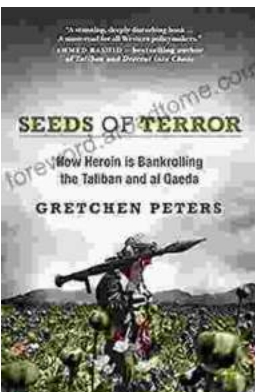
