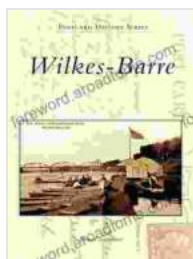


Wilkes-Barre: A City with a Rich History and Vibrant Culture

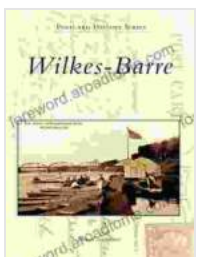
Things to do

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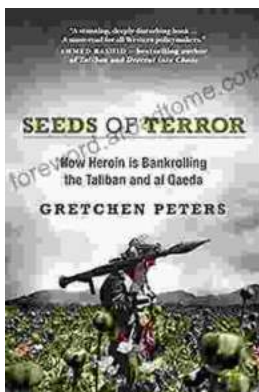
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
